School Crossing

I have been in conversation with James from Walkerville Council today, and he has been very supportive in working with the council's contractors to organise a time for this to occur. We will be meeting next Tuesday to ensure that we have a clear understanding of what will be modified and I will share this with the community as soon as possible. James knows how important this is for our community and will be working quickly in this matter. Until these actions are complete, we are not allowed to use crossing monitors. I have shared this news with the children who have volunteered to be crossing monitors and they are (understandably) very disappointed, as am I. I will let you know when we are able to recommence this important role and I thank you for your support of this important safety initiative and I apologise for this disappointment.

P&F Meeting


All families are invited to attend our next P & F meeting on Wednesday May 10 at 7pm in the Hall.
