"I was extremely cold and very lonely, it really made me feel bad for anyone who is homeless. I could barley fall to sleep and had a really rough night." Jacob

"I was bored, lonely, and felt horrible for the people that have to sleep like this every single night always finding a place to sleep. As well as you have nothing to do, except just sit there or lay down and just do absolutely nothing." Gabriel

"I was getting really emotional because homeless people live like this 24/7 and I could barely stand 1 hour so it was really tough, and it was cold." Evan

'It was very cold and we were super lonely, it was just us and our thoughts. " Aadvick

"I felt tired lonely and sad that these people have to do this every day for eight hours. They must be really strong to put up with that. I felt like I was going crazy, and I couldn't sit still. I feel great sympathy for these people. Hrishi

- "I am grateful that we have a house, a blanket, sleeping bags and a roof over our head, it was really hard for me to sleep." Shaziya
- "Sleeping in the cold and alone is not fun, it's very sad because it is very hard to sleep in the dark, alone when they're most vulnerable, which makes them feel very scared because someone might harm them." Hanz
- "You never know what they go through when they sleep, unless you try it." Megan
- "Last night I found it very emotional I started crying but then I remembered that people have to do this every day." Annabelle Hickson
- "For me it was very emotional when we had to sleep by ourselves alone and cold." ALEXIA
- "It was kind of comfortable, probably because I had a gym mat under me. Homeless people wouldn't even have some sort of mattress when they are sleeping rough." Adela
- "It was hard. I was cold, I would normally be home and I thought what are the people doing in other houses in a nice warm bed inside, not outside, like so many other Australians are having to live rough." Xavier.
- "It was very cold, I had my oodie and it still wasn't very warm, so I had to put my pillow under my oodie to make me feel more warm. It is just sad because it was still very cold for us even if we had a jumper etc, but for the homeless people, they might only have ripped clothes, some don't even have any jumpers." Hellen
