I think this quote is one I would like to borrow to summarise my first term at St Monica's. It was certainly a different start with the snap lock down but once we were back into the 'normal' business of learning and teaching, great things happened. During this term the students and staff have celebrated Book Week and Italian Day, engaged in Yoga lessons with Tammy, developed our skills in Tennis with Martin, our Tournament of the Minds team worked hard to develop their presentation and then gave it their very best during the performances last weekend.
